






#### 2020 Recession: VT vs. US




#### 2020 CENSUS — PARTIAL RESULTS

Turns out we were climbing to... +643k!!!







8 Counties – showing declines > 10%


6 Counties – showing declines > 15%






# 2007 Recession % Change in Jobs & Duration in Months: United States and Vermont Total Nonfarm Jobs





## 2007 Recession % Change in Jobs & Duration in Months: Total Nonfarm Jobs





Construction Employment, Seasonally Adjusted





Manufacturing Employment, Seasonally Adjusted







Private Education Services Employment, Seasonally Adjusted





Retail Trade Employment, Seasonally Adjusted





Leisure and Hospitality Employment, Seasonally Adjusted





Professional and Business Services Employment, Seasonally Adjusted







Health Care & Social Assistance Employment, Seasonally Adjusted











#### Vermont Unemployment Rate

Black ~6% unemployment rate




